We are now approaching a date that which, at this time, was heartily greeted by all the island population of Germany—February 18th, 1915.

Some time previously the British Government had declared the whole of the North Sea a "military area," warning trading craft that they must keep to certain routes at

"lines," and that if they took any other course they would do so at their peril. This angered the German Admiralty, for it at once prevented their using ships flying neutral flags for having submarine mines, and so they had to think out some other way of attacking us than by their above-surface craft, which they had learned by bitter experience was a costly game. They then thought of using their submarines

against our merchantmen, and accordingly a debate resumption of the policy they were about to employ was made in the following terms:

Just as Britain had designated the area between Scotland and Norway as an area of war so Germany now declares all the waters surrounding Great Britain and Ireland, including the entire English Channel, as an area of war. For this purpose, beginning

from FEBRUARY 18th, 1915, it will endeavour to destroy every enemy merchant ship that is found in the area of war, without its always being possible to avert the peril that this threatens, to persons and cargoes. Neutral are therefore warned against unloading crews and passengers and water to such ships. Their attention is also called to the fact that it is advisable for their ships to avoid entering this area, for even if the Ger-



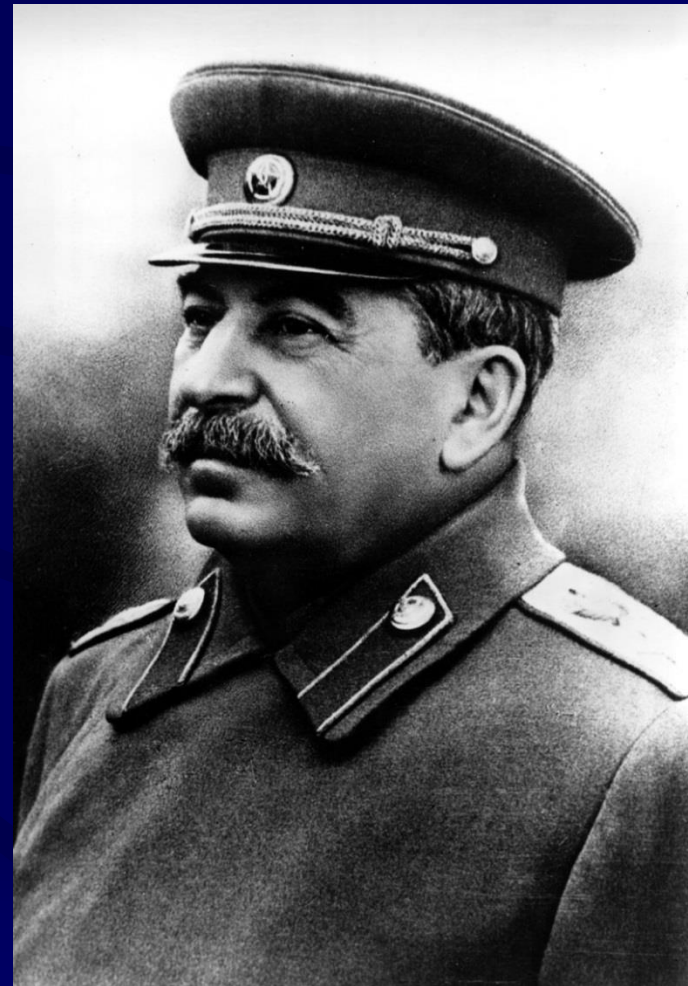
